The Continental Congress

Today, we are not unlike those [first] Pilgrims we have settled in uncharted territory;
we have lost many family and friends;
we need to band together to get through these challenges.

When the representatives of our fledgling colonies met in Philadelphia as the First Continental Congress, there was much disagreement as to what should come next. All they could agree upon during their first meeting in 1774 was the need to unite in prayer for our country. Early Congressional records show they were unified in the words of Psalm 35:28: "And my tongue shall speak of Thy righteousness and of Thy praise all the day long."

At Thanksgiving, the celebration of being God's people joins the humbling gratitude that comes from so many blessings. It was once common to hear the term "melting pot" when referring to our country. That vision of America was as a big cauldron of stew into which we threw any and all who came here to live. This conglomeration eventually boils itself down to an essence that is, supposedly, truly American.

I wonder If anyone still thinks that. Rather than a "melting pot' we are a rainbow, a collage, a patch-work quilt of difference, uniqueness, and exciting diversity. A rabbi friend of mine says, "All over the country from the Atlantic to the Pacific, from the Canadian to the Mexican border, Scandinavian Americans, Russian, German, Italian, Irish, Black, French, Hispanic, Asian, and Eastern European Americans will feel the same warmth and pride which is felt by those descended from the passengers of the Mayflower." And then there are the native, Indigenous peoples.

This Thanksgiving I want to enjoy my turkey - but not be a turkey. Before filling up on food, let's all thank God for who we are, where we are, and all that the Lord provides for us. One way is prayer. The 1774 Continental Congress could only agree on one thing. But it was the right thing - Prayer. Another way to thank God is to share through phone calls, emails and even the quaint communiques called snail mail. Practice giving out smiles that can be identified in your eyes even with mouths that are covered with masks. Remember the hungry, the lonely, the frustrated. Remember, too, that we are each a carefully designed and stitched piece of a single quilt. The likes of which the world has never seen before.

Great God, You are the Spirit of love and peace in our world.

This week, we lay before you so many things for which to give you thanks.

Inspire as we reflect together on what it means to be your people.

Then inspire us to reveal to others what that vision and promise look like.

Unite us in a sincere desire to know you and love you and to be witnesses of kindness and grace - in hearts, homes, in neighborhoods and the entire world.

Grant us a time of inner stillness that we might hear what you would have us hear and learn what you would have us learn.

And then, Lord, encourage us to be and do what you have envisioned what we can become. Amen!




