### From Pastor Bruce

People with hot tempers do foolish things... Proverbs 14:17 ...anger causes mistakes. Proverbs 14:29 Hot tempers cause arguments... Proverbs 15:18 Stupid people express their anger openly, but sensible people are patient and hold it back. Proverbs 29:11

A hot-tempered man...gets into all kinds of trouble. Proverbs 29:22

Have you ever said, "You make me so mad!"? Deep down we know that we are the ones who make the choice to be angry, but sometimes our buttons get pushed and we can't un-push them. To excuse myself I like to think I can't control my anger. The truth is I absolutely can. I just don't always get ahead of it. Or even want to. You and I have a great deal of control over our anger and I can offer proof. Have you ever been in an argument when the phone rings? One quick gulp and you change your whole demeanor. "Oh, hi, how are you? She certainly is. Honey, it's for you." Once I saw a parent going ballistic on a misbehaving child perched in the seat of the shopping cart. A loud voice, blustery tone and lots of finger pointing were being utilized. When this person, that I knew by the way, saw me coming, she turned to me and said, "Hey Bruce, how are you doing?" We talked for a couple of minutes and when they left for the next aisle, the hostile air had all but been completely dispersed. What had I done to facilitate the change? Absolutely nothing. She'd made the choice to let it go.

Humor can also help with anger disbursement. One Super Bowl Sunday I asked Jeanie who she wanted to win. She answered, "The Buccaneers." "What?" I sputtered. "Why would you pick them?" She told me she was rooting for them because of Tom Brady. "Why Tom Brady?" I demanded. Very sweetly she looked at me and said, "I do everything I can to support old men!"

Have you ever heard of a First Fight box? The idea is for the couple to each write a love letter to their partner. On their wedding day the letter and a bottle of wine are placed in a wooden box and nailed shut. When that first fight comes, they are instructed to open the box and the wine and read the letters. Then they can toast to their love. Not a bad idea!

I've learned a few things about my anger over time. I know that when I engage my mind before my mouth my life is better. I know that watching my words is the best way for me to watch my anger. Anger control is largely mouth control. I've NEVER once put my foot in my mouth when it was closed. On live TV broadcasts there is a 5 second delay in case something inappropriate happens. A word delay isn't just a good idea for TV. I need longer than 5 seconds though. You might as well.

Reflecting before reacting doesn't only help with anger. But it might help with most with anger. In doing counselling sessions with couples, I would often ask them to make a commitment to each other. The promise was that whenever an argument started brewing, they would put it off for a full 24 hours. They were not to bring it up until the same time the next day. Then, if they wanted to, they could pick up right where they left off. Every couple reported that when the time came around, they had lost the appetite for a fight. The closest to continuing battle was a husband who when asked if they had continued to quarrel said, "I wanted to, but I couldn't remember what we were fighting about!"



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
